Grant Update

June kicks off the start of our summer missions program, and with it the opportunity to expand the impact we can have with our grant funding. In the first week we had a roofing membrane installed by Glory Ridge and St. James of Wilmington, NC on an elderly woman's home in Shelton Laurel. This project builds upon the roofing skills learned last summer and kicks off a summer in which we hope to install a record 8-10 new volunteer installed roofs.

In addition to the great work that the Glory Ridge groups are doing, we are especially pleased to have Recreation Experiences working with CHC this summer. Through their summer program, they have already replaced two roofs. One of the roofing projects required replacement of half of the roof rafters after a tree fell on the roof during a violent storm last year.

These amazing results are possible through the Urgent Repair Program funding materials and training. Roofing is the single most dire repair need for our clients and the expanding capacity to repair and install new roofing is an exciting new chapter in CHC's work. Last week, our URP program administrator was in Marshall performing his annual monitoring visit and said that CHC, "is using URP funding exactly how it should be used," and encourages other agencies to adopt our community-based approach. Here at CHC we are leading the way in community-based housing repair.
